- 1. Current cadets in good standing are authorized to earn and wear multiple awards as a result of their performance and contributions while enrolled in the JROTC Program. Awards are presented to recognize outstanding academic performance, extracurricular activity participation, community service and other commendable acts.
- 2. Cadets will wear all awards in accordance with the current Lee County JROTC Standing Operating Procedure (SOP).
- 3. Cadets can be recommended for awards by their peers, parents, faculty and staff, or JROTC Cadre. The Senior Army Instructor (SAI) is the final approving authority for all JROTC awards and decorations.
- 4. Awards are divided into four categories (listed in order of precedence): Academic (10 different ribbons), Military (15 different ribbons), Athletic (5 different ribbons) and Miscellaneous (6 different ribbons). In addition, there are various additional uniform accourtements (shoulder cords, arc pins and wreaths) that can be earned by cadets based upon their levels of participation and achievement.
- 5. The following is a list of awards (school- and district-level) currently available to JROTC cadets. The list should not be considered all-inclusive, and may change from year-to-year; see the Cadre for specific award criteria:
