If you wish to apply for admission to the AICE Curriculum, please fill out the attached application. Your signature on and submission of the AICE application indicates your understanding that your current year grades, most recent standardized assessment scores, and GPA will be pulled and reviewed. Please note, if you are transferring in from outside LCSD, you will need to attach school records such as most recent report card, which reflect cumulative GPA and copies of most recent standardized test scores. Please do not attach any additional information (i.e. awards, additional recommendations, etc.) to the application. Further, the application should be submitted as is, without binders, folders, or any other form of cover sheets.

Admission to AICE courses will be based on the following:

- 1. Completion of the entire AICE application, including all requested records.
- 2. Cumulative middle school grade point average of at least a 3.0.
- 3. Successful completion of Algebra I, with a 3.0 or higher course GPA, and a passing score on the State Algebra I End of Course Exam*.
- 4. Evaluation of scores on Florida Standard Assessments*.
- 5. Review of attendance and conduct record.
- 6. Complete, thoughtful, and proficient answer to the essay question.

*OHS will verify your results on the Algebra1 EOC and FSA Assessments once the results are received.

AICE: Advanced International Certificate of Education IGCSE: International General Certificate of Secondary Education

The University of Cambridge curriculum of study (IGCSE/AICE) offers a quality education that not only ensures knowledge, but also cultivates virtues of honesty, integrity, and perseverance. Of these virtues, honor and integrity are essential to the full exercise of academic freedom. At the core of the Cambridge Honor Code is the belief that every student has the right to pursue an education free from the ills caused by any form of intellectual dishonesty. The Code exists to uphold and reinforce values central to the mission of the Cambridge AICE Curriculum, the OHS tradition of excellence, and to prevent violations of those values.

Violations of the OHS AICE ACADEMIC HONOR CODE consist of the following:

- · Receiving or giving unauthorized answers on tests, quizzes, essays, research or projects
- Using any form of "cheat sheet" on tests / quizzes
- Obtaining or giving copies of test or quiz questions prior to test time
- Copying another student's work or homework without teacher permission
- Guidance from parents or others that clearly is of undue influence (as evidenced by a comparison of day-to-day achievement of the student)
- Submitting the same academic work in more than one course without prior permission
- Intentionally copying words or ideas of authors or sources (including the internet) without giving credit to the specific source or any representation of another's work as one's own
- Fabricating information, sources, or citations
- Unauthorized use of computers
- Students who see or know about acts of academic dishonesty are honor bound to take actions to stop such violations. Such actions include speaking directly to the offender, or speaking privately to a teacher or other adult. Failure to act implies that the student condones inappropriate behavior.

The Honor Code will include <u>ALL</u> classes and offenses will be cumulative during the time the student attends OHS. CONSEQUENCES of violations of the Honor Code:

- 1 offense: Student will receive a "0" for the assignment. Parents will be notified of the incident and the incident will be recorded in the AICE office.
- 2^{nd} offense: Student will receive a "0" for the assignment. Student will receive a written reprimand. Student, Parents, teacher(s) and an administrator will attend a mandatory conference, and student will be placed on academic probation. Incident will be recorded in the AICE office.
- 3rd offense: Student will receive a "0" for the assignment and will be dismissed from the AICE Curriculum. Upon such removal from the curriculum, I understand that I am subject to all state graduation requirements.

I believe and acknowledge that academic honesty and integrity are essential to the existence and growth of any academic community. I believe and acknowledge that without maintaining high standards of honesty, integrity, and conduct the reputation of the academic community of OHS is compromised and society is poorly served. Therefore, as a student in AICE, I agree to make a commitment to uphold and support the Honor System and I shall refrain from all forms of academic dishonesty including cheating, plagiarism, and all deceitful means of obtaining good grades. I further agree to report all personal knowledge of Honor Code violations to a teacher, administrator, parent or the AICE Office.
